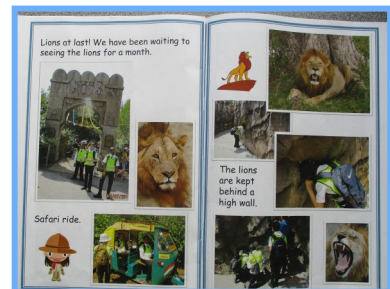
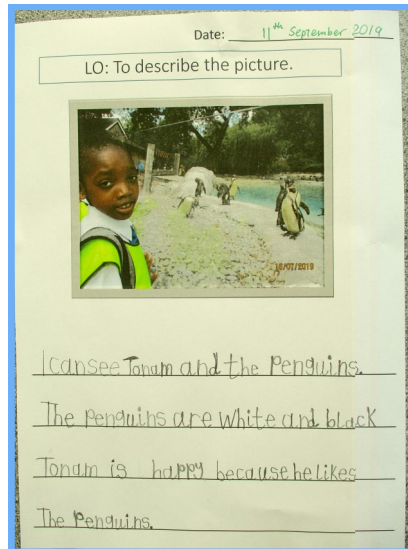
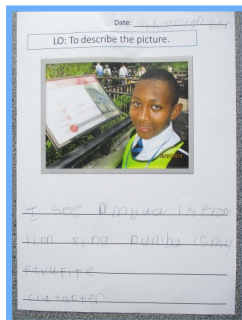
Guided Reading in 8A
