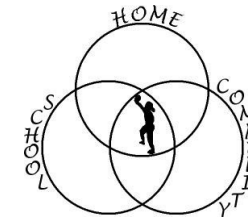

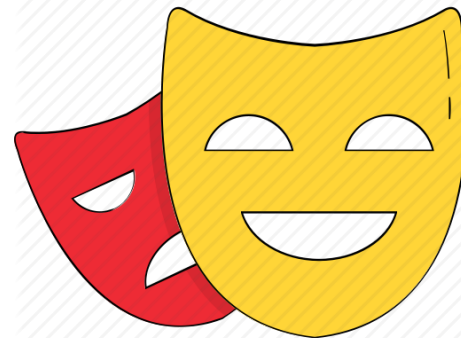

Drama

In KS3 & 4 Drama lessons this term we have worked with mime and still images. The motivation behind this is to use our bodies, movement and facial expressions to tell stories. Being able to express emotions, feelings and interactions without using words is part of the Drama curriculum. Building on this, we then added speech. First, in the form of thought tracks, creating still images that told a story, then we have written and enacted a thought track for each character. Finally, we have ended the term with dialogues. Using images and texts as inspiration, we have written dialogues and conversations between characters, which we will be enacting in the final week.

Next term the students will start to buy and store the chosen foods and will get the opportunity to

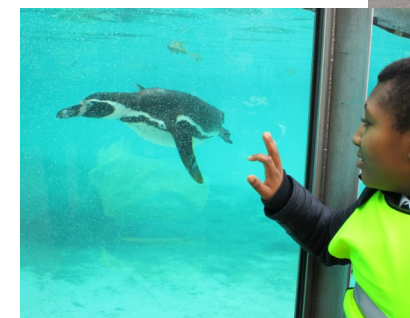
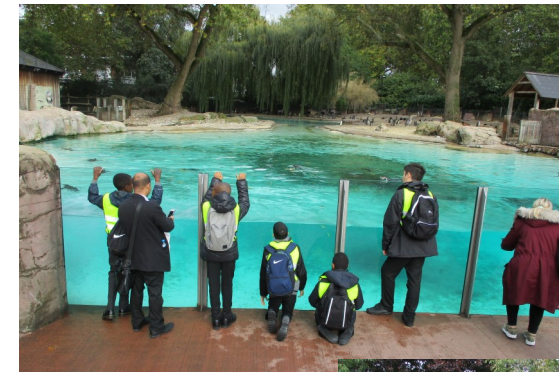
