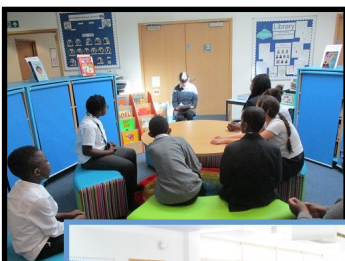
## *our visit from Margy Gungui Moro*

We will be sure to buy some of the Twisted Tales books for our library so that they can be enjoyed by a wider audience.

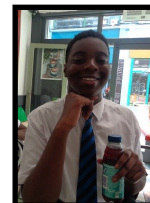




# Brixton Soup Kitchen

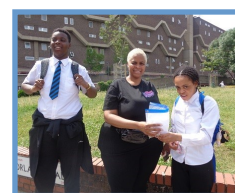

So the people in the community will not miss out during the refurbishment. On our way back the students were able to make a quick pit stop and have a refreshing drink, as it was an extremely hot day.

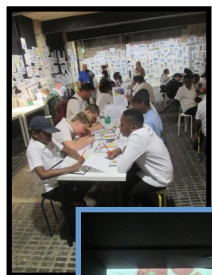
