

Simple Safe Electric Circuits



In this term's scientific experiment Year 9 students made their own "Simple Safe Electric Circuits".

In the beginning of this term Year 9 students identified that "A Simple Safe Electric Circuit" is a complete loop in which the flow of electrons (or electricity) from the battery travel through the wire; pass through the switch; the bulb and return back to the battery from its other end.

Later on this term the students were studying the symbols of each basic component of an electric circuit. After that they used their knowledge to build up their own "Simple Safe Electric Circuits".

Well Done to all Year 9 Students!






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Maria Prymachenko Exhibition
