KS3/4 Science Experiments

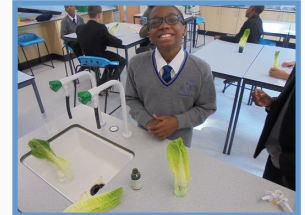


During the first term year 8,9 and 10 students tested their knowledge in different types of science experiments.



Year 8 students tested their knowledge in the planting process.

They planted their own lettuce seeds using plastic pots inside the classroom and then placed them outside in the school's garden.



Their aim is to observe them every day; to water them and by the end of the term to see the seeds grow into a small plant.



Year 9 students tested their knowledge about the water transport in plants.

Their aim is, after 1 week, to collect their results and see if their hypothesis was right or wrong.



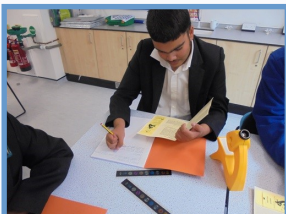
Year 10 students tested their knowledge in their first topic of the ELC exams:

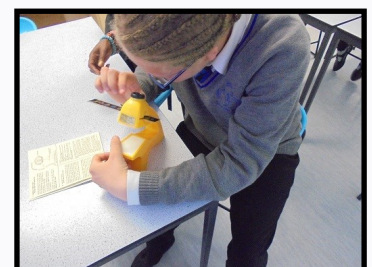

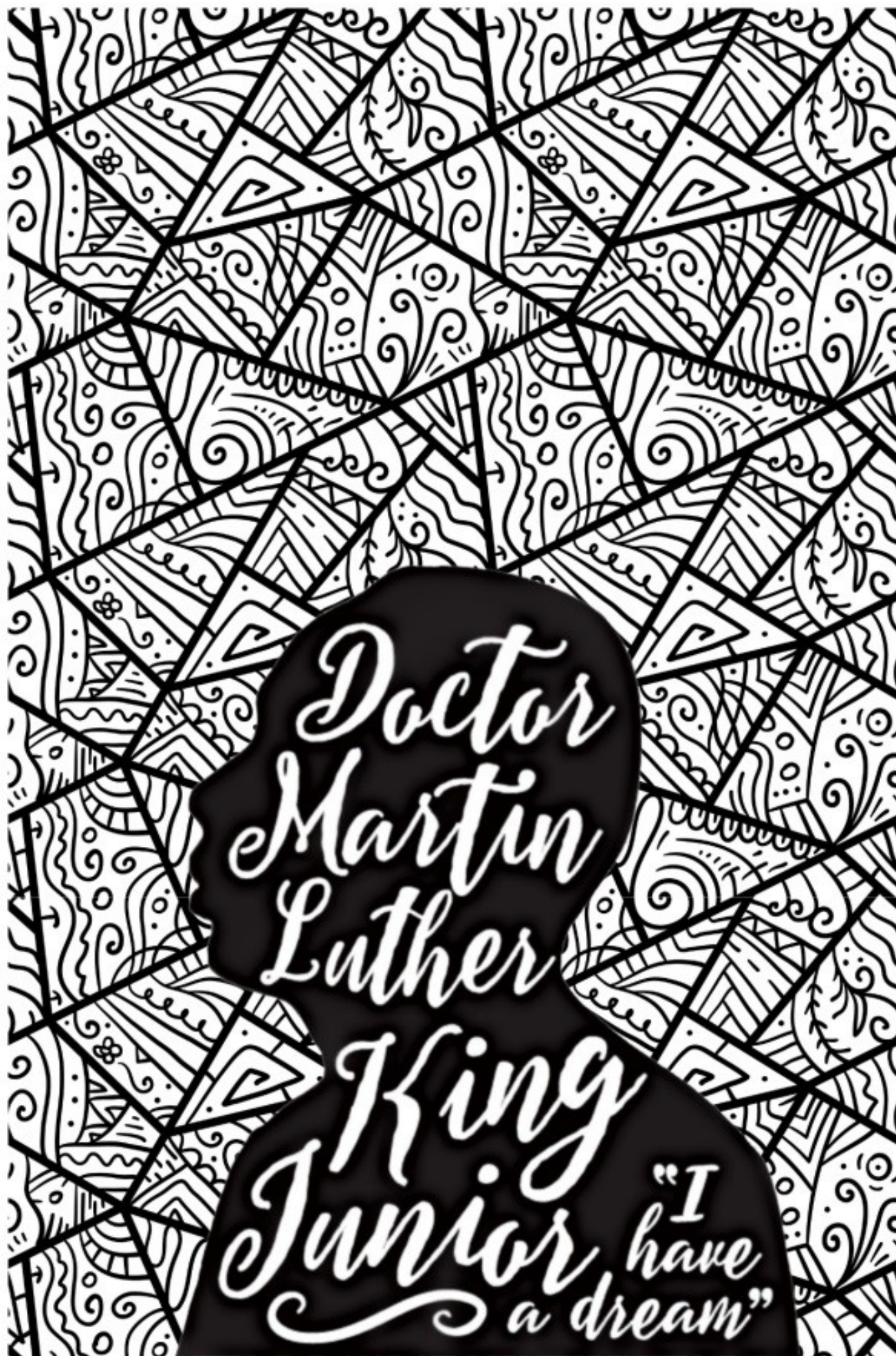
