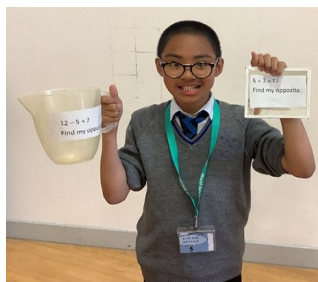
Dramatic Maths Workshops 6
