We wish our whole school community a happy and restful half term and look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 31st October.

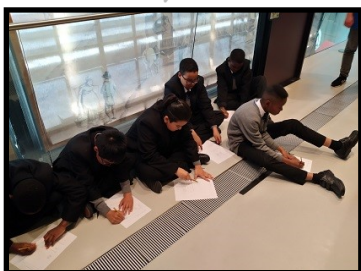

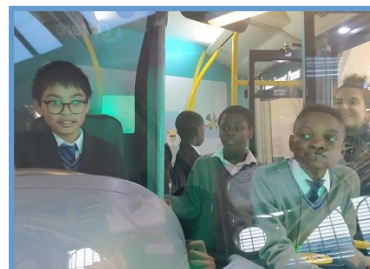

The Whitechapel Walk

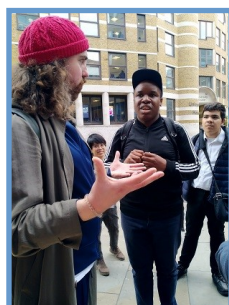
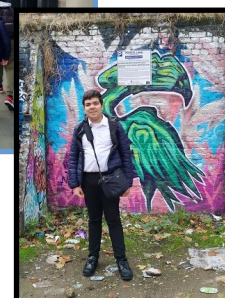
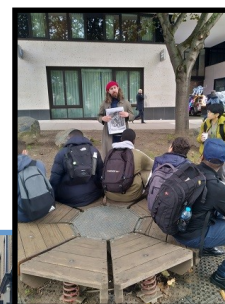


This term, our year 12 students studied the history of the Victorian era, the East End and the notorious Jack the Ripper.
