When completed write your name and form group on the back and give to Ms McNie.

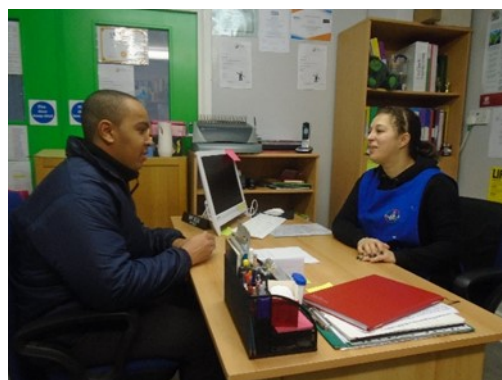

Food Tech

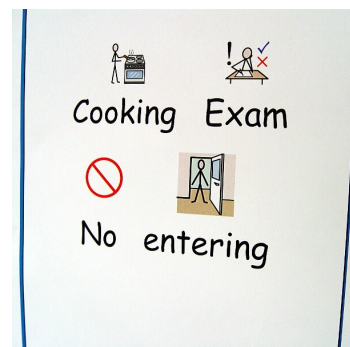
