## Risk Assessment to Manage the Infection and transmission of Covid 19 & To Keep Pupils and Staff Safe

Covid 19 is transmitted from symptomatic and asymptomactic \*\* people to others who are in close contact through respiratory droplets, by direct contact with infected persons, or by contact with contaminated objects or surfaces.

<sup>\*\*</sup> those who carry the virus and might or not might be symptomatic
