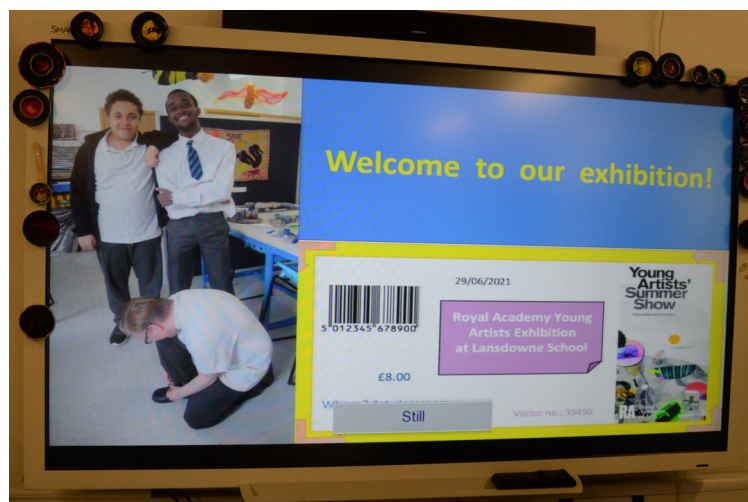


LANDSOWNE SCHOOL NEWSLETTER
