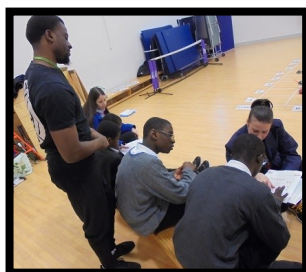

## *dramatic Maths Workshop* with Ms Thomas-Clarke

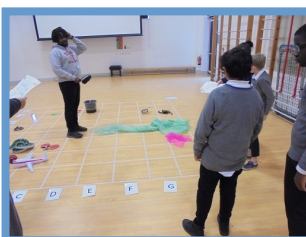


On Monday, we were joined by the team at Half Moon for the first of two Dramatic Maths workshops.

We look forward to next week's session which will be all about measuring liquids.

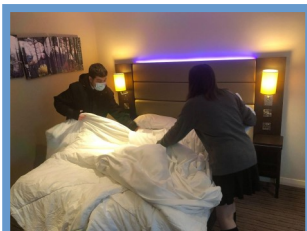




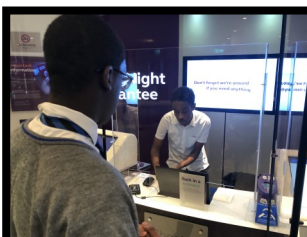

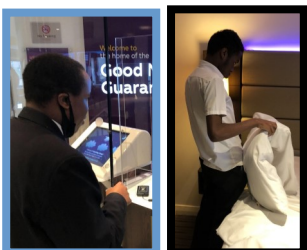
On Tuesday four Metropolitan Police Officers from Lambeth came to visit Lansdowne School. The officers gave explanations on their uniforms and equipment including when and why certain pieces of equipment are used. The highlight of the visit for many of our students was using the lights and sirens on the police vehicle. They all had a turn at controlling the blue lights and sirens.



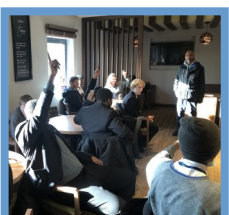
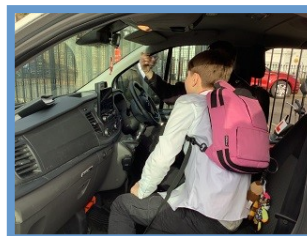
The students learned there were many different sounds that the siren made, all to move traffic out of the way safely so the police can attend an emergency situation.
